THE ST MADOC Christian Youth Camp in North Gower today celebrate their 40th anniversary. The camp, which is being renovated, is a registered charity and is non-sectarian.

To mark the occasion three stained glass panels will be unveiled by 87-year-old Mrs Alice Walters whose parents, Mr and Mrs James William Burr, were benefactors of the Camp.

The panels will be placed in the chapel, which has been renovated by the City of Swansea Community Programme. Its reopening will be performed by the Chairman of the Area Board of the Manpower Services Commission, Mr D C Williams, this morning when he hands over the key to camp trustee Mr Haydn Luff.

The name of the student from Swansea College of Art who designed the panels will be announced during the ceremony. The camp's trustees set up a competition among the students to create a design depicting the 40th anniversary, International Youth Year and the International Year of the Forest in 1985.
