Some Facts about the Camp.

The land of Gower is a place of legend and beauty. About 15 miles from Swansea, in the parish of Llanmadoc, a site has been dedicated by Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Burr, as a YOUTH CAMP, for the Christian Service of Youth. The Camp is set in one of the most lovely and least frequented places in South Wales. It is near the sea, and has an extensive beach, open headlands, and fern-covered fields. There the beauty of unspoiled nature, the meaning and mystery of the past, together with the visions and service of young people are joined in a practical venture of Youth Leadership and Training by the building up of a Christian Community, prophetic of the New World Order which is to be, in which every phase of human life must be integrated.

The venture started at the time of the Swansea Blitz, and because of it—
"When life was being shattered, this place
Was given for the healing of the soul."

Mr. and Mrs. Burr have generously given the site of 76 acres under a Trust Deed, and the Trustees are Mr. and Mrs. Burr, their son and daughter, Rev. Rosalind Lee, Prof. Olive Wheeler, D.Sc., Rev. Gwilym Rees, M.A., The Rt. Hon. James Griffiths, M.P., and the Rev. Maurice Charles, B.A., B.D., B.Litt.

The Management Committee of the Camp is composed of an active and responsible body of men and women, who have given splendid and sacrificial service from the commencement. This Committee acts under a Constitution, which provides for the representation of the Welsh and English Churches, and bodies such as The Rotary Club, Soroptimists, and Youth organisations.

By the efforts of the young people, the Management Committee, and the Camp officers, we have built up accommodation for 100 residents. Last summer young people dug out of our own ground 300 tons of sand and stone, and made solid foundations upon which they erected, and adapted, dormitory, and dining hall units. This summer, members of the following denominations will visit, or be resident at the Camp—English and Welsh Baptists, Church in Wales, American English and Welsh Congregationalists, Elm Four Square, Methodist, Presbyterian Church of Wales, and Unitarians. Other bodies which will be resident include Federation of Girls' Clubs, Toc H., Llanmadoc Religion and Life Fellowship, Music and Arts Club, the Dowlais and Risca Educational Settlements.

We have an adequate staff for the domestic management of the Camp and the American Congregational Christian Churches have sent the Rev. Edith Wolfe, B.A., B.D., to serve as our Education Officer.

Our Aim and Purpose is to train young people from the Churches and Youth Organisations for Christian Citizenship, Community Service, and active Church membership, and the basis of our programme is Worship, Bible Study, and the application of our Christian beliefs in life, thought, and work. Every young person who comes to the Camp takes his or her share in the duties, discussions, and devotions, and each group aims at leaving the Camp better than they found it. We have increasing evidence of the influence of our work upon the young people who come, and of their awakened urge to Christian service, their desire for fellowship with others in Christ, and an indelible experience that God is Living, and that Life is Good.

The running expenses of the Camp are met each year by the contributions of young people themselves. They pay an annual Membership Fee of 5/-, and 5/- a day for their maintenance. The capital outlay involved in the purchase, erection, and adaptation of our buildings, amounting to more than £2,000, and the necessity of installing a system of water and sanitation which will cost a further £2,000 as soon as the money is available, has necessitated our making this our first public appeal for the work. We are grateful to you for the help given in the past, and we look to you for co-operation and support in the future.

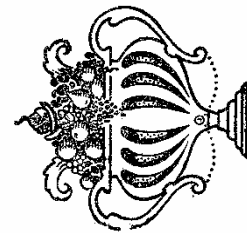
